

Quick Guide Waste Sorting

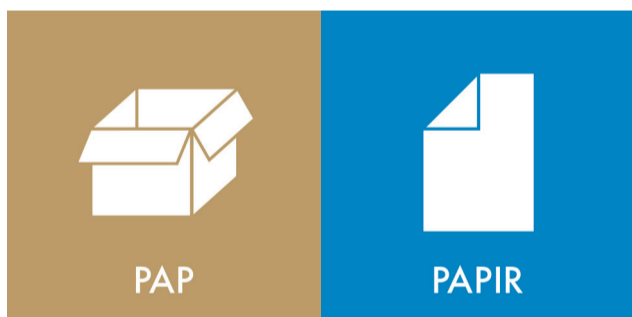
TIP: Download the app "Affaldsportal." Here, you can search for specific types of waste that might not be included in this guide.



- What should go in 'Hazardous waste'?**
- Spray cans (e.g., hairspray and deodorants)
 - Small electronics
 - Batteries (placed in a clear bag)
 - Light bulbs (placed in a clear bag)
 - Nail polish
 - Small electronics (e.g., mobile phones)
 - Chemical-based cosmetics
 - Cleaning products with hazard labels

TIP: Hazardous waste can be dropped off at selected parcel lockers around Aalborg and Nørresundby.

Search for 'Pakkebokse Aalborg hazardous waste' in Google.



- What should go in 'Paper and cardboard'?**
- Newspapers and advertisements
 - Egg cartons
 - Cereal boxes
 - Envelopes
 - Rolls from toilet paper and kitchen towels
 - Cardboard (A4 size; otherwise, it may block the container)

TIP: All paper and cardboard must be dry and clean for recycling.

- What should go in 'Plastic, metal, and cartons'?**
- Plastic bags and wraps
 - Plastic bottles and metal cans (without deposit)
 - Aluminum foil
 - Canned goods
 - Aluminum trays
 - Drink cartons in all varieties
 - Small metal pieces (but not sharp objects, which should be disposed of in 'Metal' at the recycling center)

TIP: Make sure to scrape off as much food residue as possible to aid in recycling and maintain hygiene during the process.

NOTE: You may use your own bags for residual waste, which you can purchase at the supermarket.

- What should go in 'Residual waste'?**
- Takeaway pizza boxes
 - Coffee and chip bags (unless otherwise indicated on the bag)
 - Styrofoam (can also be disposed of at the recycling center under 'Flamingo')
 - Gift ribbons
 - Dirty paper and cardboard

TIP: In the city center, there is an annual distribution of residual waste bags, but they can also be picked up at the library, recycling centers, and some parcel lockers.

IMPORTANT: Food waste MUST go into the bags we provide. Otherwise, it will not be recognized by our optical sensor at the food waste facility. Therefore, it is not possible to use your own bags.

- What should go in 'Food waste'?**
- Spoiled food
 - Cooking fat
 - Meat scraps and bones
 - Coffee grounds + used coffee filter
 - Tea bags
 - Fruit peels
 - Cut flowers without soil

TIP: In the city center, there is an annual distribution of food waste bags, but they can also be picked up at the library, recycling centers, and some parcel lockers.

REMEMBER TO TIE THE KNOT ON FOOD WASTE AND RESIDUAL WASTE BAGS! Excess loose waste can cause issues at our facility.
